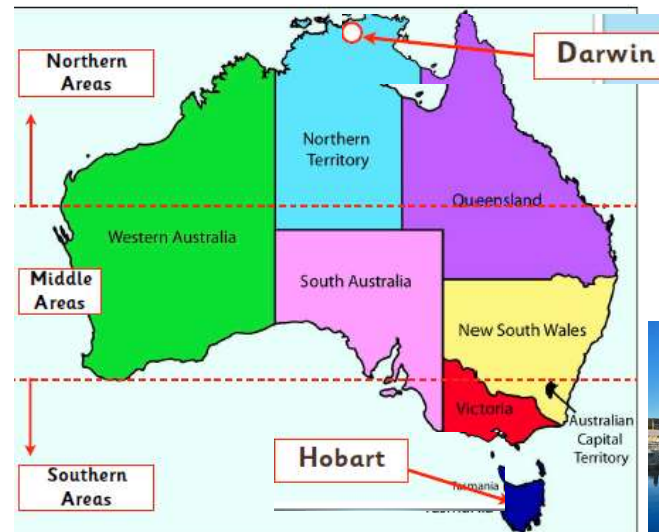

Key Vocabulary

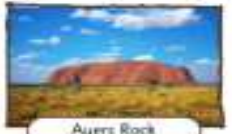
Continent	A large area of solid land. There are 7 continents. Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Europe, Antarctica, Australia
States	There are 6 states in Australia. Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania, South Australia and Western Australia.
Physical Features	They would be here even if there were no people around such as seas, rivers and mountains.
Landmarks	An object or feature that is easily seen and recognised from a distance.
Climate	Weather in a particular place, over a long period of time.
Aboriginal	The original people living within a region.
Desert	A large, extremely dry area of land with few plants growing there.
